

ince taking the helm at L.A. Care Health Plan in 2014, CEO John Baackes' visionary leadership, relentless dedication and commitment to advancing health equity have made a lasting impact on L.A. Care's members, providers and employees.

Recognizing that non-medical factors can significantly impact health outcomes, Baackes has prioritized reinvesting in the community to address the health and social needs of its members and their communities, including generous support for the safety net providers who serve L.A. Care members.

One of the ways L.A. Care is building healthier communities thanks to Baackes' leadership is the Community Health Investment Fund (CHIF), which strengthens community health and fills gaps in health coverage for low-income Angelenos. To date, CHIF has invested \$138 million via 970 grants to support programs that improve the health and support the social needs of under-resourced community members. Also, L.A. Care's Elevating the Safety Net initiative is designed to address a looming physician shortage. The \$205 million initiative is comprised of programs to train, recruit and retain diverse and highly qualified primary care physicians for the LA County safety net. Another impactful success is L.A. Care's Community Resource Centers are jointly operated with Blue Shield of California Promise Health Plan. L.A. Care has invested \$71 million in 14 centers, which provide a range of health-focused classes, programs and services that promote the well-being of members and the communities where they live.

Baackes also currently serves as chairman of the Board for Charles R. Drew University of Medicine and Science located in South Los Angeles. It is the only federally designated institution on the "Historically Black Colleges and Universities" list west of Texas.

od Hanners, CEO of Keck Medicine of USC, oversees USC's clinical activities, including USC Care Medical Group (Keck Medicine's network of physicians who provide outpatient services and procedures); Keck Medical Center, which includes Keck Hospital and USC Norris Cancer Hospital; USC Verdugo Hills Hospital; USC Arcadia Hospital; and more than more than 100 unique clinics in Los Angeles, Orange, Kern, Tulare and Ventura counties, as well as Las Vegas.

Hanners is highly regarded for promoting a culture of trust and teamwork and is deeply committed to ensuring that physicians and staff receive the support they need to care for themselves and provide exceptional patient care.

Under Hanners' leadership, Keck Medicine continues its exponential growth and expansion as well as is nationally recognized for excellence. For example, in the fall of 2023, Keck Hospital earned five stars, the highest rating possible, on the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) 2023 quality star rating report. Only approximately 16% of hospitals across the country, 483 out of 3,076, received five stars out of a one-to-five-star rating system.

Hanners also led Keck Medicine through the launch of its new transplant clinic in Las Vegas for pre- and post-transplant care. Up until now, most patients in the area had to find services out of state. He also oversaw Keck Medicine's topping off (putting the last beam on construction) for the state-of-the-art medical complex in Pasadena that will bring 100,000 square feet of services to the San Gabriel Valley when it is finished in the spring of 2025.

oward Berger, MD, began his career as a physician and along the way, became a visionary in healthcare. He saw that screening and diagnostic imaging procedures were fundamental to finding and treating diseases early and that access to these services should be available to everyone, in every community. In 1980, Dr. Berger founded RadNet based upon a model of outpatient advanced medical imaging services, provided for the community at large. The mission was simple: high quality, conveniently accessible care in the most cost-effective manner possible. Since its inception, RadNet has been a pioneer in radiologic healthcare and is now the leading national provider of freestanding, fixed-site diagnostic imaging services and related information technology solutions in the United States.

Dorothy Seleski, a longtime senior health care leader in Los Angeles, was the key woman in Health Net's successful implementation of one of the largest health care transitions in county history. Just before the end of 2022, the state Department of Health Care services awarded a contract to Health Net to be one of two primary Medi-Cal contractors in LA County. As part of the contract award, Health Net was required to assign half of its membership to subcontractor Molina – a unique requirement not made of any other health plan in the state.

Seleski managed the team that implemented the ever-changing requirements from the state, personally negotiated with the subcontractor and ensured a relatively smooth transition for the members and providers. Without her more than 35 years of experience and the breadth of her experience, this wouldn't have been possible and the disruption could have been immense.

As the medical director of the AltaMed and Omnicare IPA, he has helped enhance health equity and improve community health in Los Angeles County. From engaging with primary care clinics to help elevate performance, to working with specialists to enhance care, to creating interdisciplinary care teams to reduce hospital re-admissions and serve highrisk patients, his sustained drive to promote health equity and improve health outcomes has touched countless lives.

In his role, Dr. Sunkara has created new programs focused on interdisciplinary care management of high-risk patients with frequent hospital admissions. This program has helped improve treatment coordination and helped create new partnerships with primary care clinics. He has taken a lead role in ensuring quality of care for hospice patients and their families.

HOSPITAL CEO OR PRESIDENT OF THE YEAR HONOREE

### **JOHNESE SPISSO**

President, UCLA Health; CEO, UCLA Hospital System UCLA Health

or the past eight years, Johnese Spisso has been responsible for all operations and regional outreach strategy for UCLA Health, a comprehensive academic health system that includes five hospitals, a faculty practice group and 280 primary and specialty care clinics in Southern California. During her tenure, UCLA Health has added more than 100 clinics and taken multiple other steps to enhance patient access, including the recent acquisition of the 260-bed West Hills Hospital (now UCLA West Valley Medical Center).

Under Spisso's leadership, UCLA Health has made a strategic investment in the Los Angeles community. Her bold moves have increased convenience for patients living and working in the region and provided more hospital capacity in the UCLA Health system to serve those who require highly specialized care and treatment. She's also improved access to high-quality care among people experiencing homelessness in Los Angeles. Since launching in January 2022, the UCLA Health Homeless Healthcare Collaborative has completed more than 27,000 patient encounters and delivered more than 7,000 medical and psychiatric evaluations. The community-based clinical teams travel to shelters, encampments and streets around Los Angeles in five fully equipped vans. The program was awarded a \$25.3 million state grant to expand.

Spisso led collaborations with the Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health to expand to all ages Medi-Cal coverage for hospitalized psychiatric patients. In 2021, UCLA Health acquired a closed hospital that is being converted into a state-of-the art neuropsychiatric hospital that will expand psychiatric bed capacity by 60%. Construction on the Mid-Wilshire campus is scheduled to be completed in 2026.

A lice Issai was named president of Adventist Health Glendale in 2018. The hospital has since earned continuous five-star ratings from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, received 19 consecutive "A" ratings from the Leapfrog Group, and been repeatedly recognized by Healthgrades as a top 5% American hospital.

Issai is the first woman to lead the 515bed hospital. Under her guidance, Adventist Health Glendale continues to grow as a tertiary center for cardiovascular, pulmonary, cancer, digestive health, neurology and stroke care, offering state-of-the-art treatment to patients across Southern California. Emerging new offerings, such as its fast-developing Digestive Disease Center, aim to expand the hospital's community impact further. Issai's dedication to innovation and transforming community health paved the way for creating the Sam and Grace Carvajal Comprehensive Breast Center, where expert surgeons and multidisciplinary specialists offer a wide range of advanced treatment methodologies.

A lina Moran is the first Latina president of Dignity Health-California Hospital Medical Center (CHMC) which has been serving the Los Angeles community since 1887. Moran joined CHMC in March 2020, just as the pandemic was upending life as we knew it. Her steady leadership helped enable the hospital's team of 1,900 employees and 450 medical staff to care for more than 2,000 COVID-positive patients and save numerous lives, all while continuing to provide services that the community has relied upon for decades, including 24/7 emergency and trauma care, cardiac and stroke care, and maternity care.

Moran has also prioritized staff well-being and has moved the needle on building for the hospital's future, overseeing completion of a \$215 million campus expansion project, the centerpiece of which is a new patient care tower set to open in late 2024.



zar Kattan is the chief operations officer for Harbor-UCLA Medical Center. In this role, she is responsible for the day-to-day operations of Harbor-UCLA Medical Center, a 453-bed level 1 trauma hospital. Harbor-UCLA is also a safety net hospital, serving the southwestern portion of Los Angeles County and providing services to patients from underserved communities.

In her role, Kattan directs the hospital's operations, which include supervising ancillary and supportive clinical services and leading over 1,700 personnel in the departments of Laboratory, Radiology, Pharmacy, Food and Nutrition, Clinical Social Work, as well hospital support services including Environment Health and Safety/Emergency Preparedness, Facilities/Capital Asset Management, Patient Access Center, Supply Chain Operations, Security, and Environmental Services. She partners with the hospital's chief executive officer, chief nursing officer and chief medical officer to develop and implement the hospital's strategic plan and work to facilitate alignment of the mission and goals with daily work.

In addition to her daily operational responsibilities, Kattan has led, since 2015, the planning activities for the \$1.7 billion campus replacement project, which will result in the construction of a new 347-bed inpatient tower, Clinic Building, lab building, central plant, support services building and parking structure. She shepherded this project from the initial planning phases through the medical planning, design-build solicitation and to the construction and opening, to date, of the parking structure and support services building. She has driven the planning process, bringing together clinical and ancillary subject matter experts and leaders from across the hospital to participate in the design of the new campus and buildings.

Over 40% of CHLA's patients are covered by Medi-Cal and represent some of the most vulnerable people in Los Angeles. In addressing these challenges, M. Scott Lieberenz's leadership has been steadfast and his experience in the industry has proven to be extremely valuable. CHLA's total change in net assets in 2022 was a loss of over \$100 million dollars. In 2023, with the fiscal lead ership of Lieberenz, the loss was reduced to about \$44 million dollars.

Lieberenz's role in CHLA also makes him an integral part of the board of CHLA. He has many people within his team that he continues to coach and mentor from a leadership perspective. Lieberenz has also continued to mentor people outside of CHLA.





On the volunteer front, Sackman is a mentor at Tech Stars Los Angeles and is also involved as an advisor with Tech Strat Up Healthcare Accelerator program in Los Angeles. Through his involvement, Sackman is helping other entrepreneurs improve healthcare for people around the world.


### **SOUTH CENTRAL FAMILY HEALTH CENTER**

### PROVIDENCE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA

ive days a week, Providence community health workers and volunteers from the San Fernando Community Health Center and the Wilmington Community Clinic walk door-to-door in the Northeast Valley and the South Bay. Their mission is to connect with residents to identify needs and provide links to resources. Similarly, Providence Holy Cross Medical Center in Mission Hills and Providence Little Company of Mary Medical Center Centers in San Pedro and Torrance were among 10 organizations chosen by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health to participate in the Public Health Teams Project in designated underserved communities.

So far, in just two months, the teams have knocked on 3,500 doors, collected 220 completed health assessment surveys, developed by the public health department, and connected residents to primary care providers, food banks and access to public benefits and insurance programs.

This is the 165-year-old Providence mission of outreach, enhanced by the promise of "know me, care for me, ease my way," at work outside the walls of the health organization's six LA-area hospitals. In a similar effort to meet people where they live, Providence partners with Northgate Markets, which has more than 40 grocery stores in Greater Los Angeles. Together the organizations seek to improve access to health care, to provide nutrition education aimed at identifying affordable healthful foods and to create education pathways for all ages to help improve the health of their communities.

Another priority is to expand an already robust community health program by addressing health equity in predominantly Black and Latinx neighborhoods, plagued by disparities and limited access to preventive care.

### L.A. CARE HEALTH PLAN

uring the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020, a federal public health emergency went into effect, which put a freeze on the regular enrollment process for Medi-Cal beneficiaries so that people would maintain health benefits during the pandemic.

After about three years, Medi-Cal enrollees would once again have to take steps to renew their health care coverage. With the understanding that many beneficiaries may have forgotten about the regular process, L.A. Care initiated a comprehensive multiphase, multi-touchpoint outreach campaign over 15 months. A variety of messaging in multiple languages was developed to target diverse audiences, including easy-to-understand information on what to expect and what action to take to maintain coverage. While some elements were aimed specifically at L.A. Care members, many of these outreach tactics were geared to the public at large in LA County, where a significant portion of residents are Medi-Cal beneficiaries.




### SPEAR RECOVERY

pear Recovery is a men's sober living focused on rebuilding its guest's lives and supporting them in the early stages of their recovery. There is much more to a life in recovery than just the abstinence from drugs and alcohol. Spear aims to provide a safe, supportive and fun environment for men of all ages. No matter how deep and strong the grasp of addiction has taken them, the combination of some willingness and a supportive community with a common goal can produce incredible results.

Spear Recovery's first and utmost priority is the safety of its guests. The house is staffed 24 hours a day with a live-in manager on site. All guests are breathalyzed daily and drug tested randomly 3-5 times a week. Staff works closely and has one-one-one interactions with clients to provide emotional support and encourage healthy habits and relationships.

# SUTTER HEALTH and CHARLES R. DREW UNIVERSITY OF MEDICINE

utter Health and Charles R. Drew University of Medicine and Science (CDU), located in Los Angeles, have partnered to address physician shortages and health inequities across California. Sutter is one of the nation's largest integrated health care systems, and Charles Drew is the only federally designated Historically Black institution west of Texas. The two organizations recently announced a long-term collaboration to expand access to a more inclusive and equitable care experience in California.

The effort kicks off with the launch of two significant initiatives. The first is one of the largest scholarship programs in CDU's history, designed to widen pathways for diverse physicians. The second is the creation of the Health Equity Alliance for Research & Evaluation (HEARE) to serve as an incubator lab to accelerate health equity research into clinical practice. This unique collaboration is a significant step toward building a more equitable health care system in California and just the beginning of work to clear paths for medical education, enhanced clinical care, robust research and improved community health.

CDU opened its new, nationally accredited medical school in 2023, making it one of only four Historically Black Medical Schools in America. Sutter's \$7.5 million initial investment will provide five full-tuition scholarships across five cohorts (2024-2028), totaling 25 scholarships. Additionally, it will fund HEARE over the next five years to help accelerate interventions that address root causes of inequities. Sutter Health and CDU will also explore additional opportunities to expand the partnership and train more physicians with future initiatives.

hat would it be like to have a career in medicine? This is a question on the minds of the dozens of local high schoolers who since 2019 have taken part in USC Verdugo Hills Hospital's annual Healthcare Day of Discovery. During this annual event, the hospital partners with local schools to introduce students to diverse opportunities in health care, spanning science, nursing, information technology and business administration.

As students approach crucial college and post-high school decisions, this collaborative event provides invaluable insights into various career paths within the industry. The event also helps fill the current need for health care workers locally. In the past five years, about 250 students have spent the day at the hospital to get hands-on medical experience. This year, 74 students from 11 local high schools learned and performed basic health care skills from front line staff.

### **KECK MEDICINE OF USC**

o combat physician burnout and increase time spent in meaningful communication with patients, rather than on their charts, Inderbir Gill, MD, a Keck Medicine of USC urologist and founding executive director of the USC Institute of Urology, is leading efforts at Keck Medicine of USC to automate patient record-taking through a program called the AI-Automated Physician Co-Pilot. This program saves both the physician and patient valuable time and reduces repetitive tasks.

The technology is provided in collaboration with OneLine Health, a web-based platform co-founded by Dr. Gill that enhances the medical consultation experience from both the patient and provider perspective. Using the AI-Automated Physician Co-Pilot platform, patients fill out a "smart" form at home before their appointment. The form prompts new questions based on the patient's answers. Once the patient fills out the form, which takes 10-15 minutes, the notes go directly into the patients' electronic record, along with the appropriate medical codes. So, when the doctor sees the patient, the doctor is already up to speed.

Of all the disciplines, urology physicians have the highest rate of burn out -54%, according to a 2020 Medscape survey. Therefore, Dr. Gill recently rolled out and completed a pilot program among some 8,000 urologic patients, along with colleagues at four other institutions representing a diverse group of patients.

The results of the pilot study were stunning. Physicians found that 88-91% of patients complied with filling out the automated form, a result that held steady no matter the patient's educational level, geographical location or income level. Patients reported a 97-98% higher satisfaction, and providers reported a net higher satisfaction of 92%.





## ADVANCED ONCOLOGY REDONDO BEACH

ed by Dr. Chad Sila, the dedicated team at Advanced Oncology South Bay in Redondo Beach is committed to delivering personal and state-of-the-art radiation treatment with compassion and expertise.

Dr. Sila and team offer a full and comprehensive range of advanced treatment options, including Stereotactic Body Radiotherapy, Stereotactic Radiosurgery, Intensity-Modulated Radiation Therapy with arc therapy, Image-Guided Radiation Therapy, 3D Radiation Treatment Planning, and High Dose Rate Remote Afterloading Brachytherapy. Patients report that Dr. Sila and his team provide care with skill, compassion and warmth for all patients needing radiation oncology care. At Advanced Oncology Centers, the team strives to surround patients with a strong team dedicated to comfort and peace of mind. Whith over 25 years of service supporting mental health for residents in skilled nursing facilities, Executive Mental Health (EMH) has developed a reputation for its partnerships and quality of care, especially among older adults. To support the growth of the company, EMH started a new Psychiatric Services Division in 2021 to offer an interdisciplinary model of care.

As director of the division, psychiatrist Dr. Brian Wu was charged with starting the new services offering and successfully completed the development of the division's scope, established the operation, including the team selection, training, and management, and garnered business growth of the client base with SNF partners by providing high quality patient care. Dr. Wu and the EMH team launched EMH Psychiatry in the height of the pandemic and amidst a challenging environment filled with uncertainty. Dr. Wu and EMH quickly responded by bringing a human element to a telehealth offering.



### **MEDVECTOR CLINICAL TRIALS**

FINALIST

Patients today want to hear about clinical trials from their doctor, not a Facebook ad. MedVector is revolutionizing health equity and diversity in clinical trials by enabling healthcare providers to host clinical trial appointments from alternative locations. The result creates greater access to patients for clinical trial sites, faster time-to-market for new medications, health equity for advanced medications as treatment alternatives and saves lives.

MedVector allows treating physicians to maintain control of the patient relationship and generate revenue, while the investigator team maintains control of the protocol, source data, and GCP. Using MedVector, patients can virtually travel to the clinical trial site for their appointment at the clinical trial site, with the investigator team.



### **SOLLIS HEALTH**

**FINALIST** 

Ollis Health provides members with unlimited visits and same day appointments to treat common illnesses, emergencies, and everything in between. Patients have 24/7, 365-days-per-year access to in-house physicians via phone, text, or video – even if they are traveling. A dedicated care team handles the coordination of appointments, administrative tasks and continuity of care between members and doctors so patients don't have added worry in their busy lives. In addition, expedited access to a network of 1,500 leading specialists enables members to skip the waitlist and secure an appointment in days instead of weeks.

Sollis Health's diagnostic capability is on par with an ER, including onsite advanced imaging and lab testing, often with same-day results. Should a member require hospitalization, Sollis Health can help secure direct admission and VIP hospital services. Sollis Health centers average a wait time of 3.5 minutes vs. the average ER wait time of 3.5 hours.



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# A Visionary Leader to Retire from Largest Public Health Plan in the Country

he healthcare system in the United States is complicated - there are multiple insurers, thousands of regulations, dozens of different types of medical professionals and many stakeholders. Millions of people work in the healthcare industry, all striving to balance cost, quality, and access. One healthcare executive has used his visionary leadership to navigate the complexities and steer the largest public health plan in the nation through tremendous growth, major policy changes at the state level, and a pandemic. John Baackes, the CEO of L.A. Care Health Plan, who in April announced he's retiring at the end of the year, will leave behind a legacy of relentless dedication to under-resourced Angelenos, L.A. Care members, and unwavering support for their communities, health care providers and staff.

Every program Baackes spearheaded at L.A. Care has been with the clear intent of adding value to providers and members.

Baackes joined L.A. Care in 2015, with the philosophy that health care is more than a plastic card in your wallet. He frequently posed the question, "how are we adding value to our members and providers," and importantly recognized that non-medical factors can significantly impact health outcomes. As a result, he prioritized strategic investments in the community to address the health and social needs of L.A. Care members and all Angelenos. The investments included support for the safety net providers to serve the health plan's members.

Not long after arriving at L.A. Care, Baackes advocated to the health plan's Board of Governors to raise its annual Community Health Investment Fund (CHIF) from \$5 million to \$10 million. To date, CHIF has invested \$138 million via 970 grants to support programs that improve the health and support the social needs of under-resourced community members.

In a separate investment, Baackes asked the L.A. Care Board to approve the Elevating the Safety Net program, a \$205 million effort launched in 2018 to address a growing physician shortage. The physician shortage disproportionately impacts low-income communities of color, the communities L.A. Care serves.

The innovative initiative is comprised of four programs. One program provides grants to clinics and practices to use to recruit new primary care physicians into the LA County safety net. Another offers medical school loan repayment grants to new doctors who commit to working in the safety net for three years. The initiative also provides eight full-ride scholarships each year to medical school students who have expressed an interest in serving under-resourced communities. Elevating the Safety Net also includes a 10-week training program for In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) workers, teaching them critical skills such as CPR, first aid, nutrition, infection control, and more. To date, the program has yielded 188 newly recruited physicians, which equates to as many as 376,000 Angelenos having increased access to care. Moreover, 192 doctors were awarded loan repayments and 56 students received medical school scholarships.

In a show of his commitment to the communities where L.A. Care members live, Baackes approved a \$73 million investment for a network of Community Resource Centers, which are jointly operated with Blue Shield of California Promise Health Plan. The centers provide a range of fitness and nutrition classes, programs and other services that promote health and well-being to all Angelenos for free, regardless of insurance status. When the partnership launched, there were seven centers, with plans for 14. Twelve centers are currently open, with the last two scheduled to open by the end of the year.

When Baackes joined L.A. Care, the health plan served more than 1.7 million members in Los Angeles County, and the vast majority were Medi-Cal beneficiaries. With

continued expansion due to the Affordable Care Act (ACA) and California allowing all who are financially eligible to apply for Medi-Cal, regardless of immigration status, the health plan now serves about 2.6 million members. That number includes the health plan's ever growing membership in L.A. Care Covered, its plan on California's ACA exchange. As a public plan that is not beholden to shareholders, L.A. Care is able to keep rates affordable. In fact, for the fourth year in a row, L.A. Care is offering the most affordable rates across all coverage tier levels in Los Angeles County. This has forced its commercial competitors to sharpen their pencils to try to keep their rates more affordable.

Throughout L.A. Care's tremendous growth, Baackes maintained his position as a national leader in promoting equitable health care for low-income individuals. To ensure health equity for L.A. Care members, Baackes expanded the network of physicians who directly contract with the health plan. Since L.A. Care's Direct Network launched in 2016, it has grown to more than 500 practices and nearly 1,200 physicians, giving providers a choice and improving their efficiency, while increasing access to care for members, especially in areas like the Antelope Valley, which had long been underserved.

Also under Baackes' leadership, the health plan established a grading and incentivization

system that holds medical groups accountable for quality care. The health plan uses a set of metrics such as member satisfaction, utilization, and encounter timeliness to ensure it has the best-performing network of providers.

Every program Baackes spearheaded at L.A. Care has been with the clear intent of adding value to providers and members. He was instrumental in pulling together a coalition of stakeholders across health care in California to advocate for higher Medi-Cal reimbursement rates. California's persistently low reimbursement rates makes it difficult to attract providers into safety net clinics and practice


When Baackes leaves L.A. Care, it will cap a more than 45-year career at health plans, which included time at plans in New York, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania before he moved to Los Angeles. While he will no longer work with a health plan, he will continue to have an impact on health care in Los Angeles County. He recently became the Chair of the Board of Trustees at Charles R. Drew University of Medicine and Science in Los Angeles.

Baackes has called L.A. Care a 'pioneering agency,' but it has been through his innovative and strategic stewardship that the health plan has been able to launch some of its most groundbreaking and inspirational programs.

### A LEGACY THAT GROWS **IN IMPORTANCE**


During her storied career at Doheny, Goldberg has held a variety of roles and she continues to work tirelessly to help advance vision science. In 2013, Goldberg and the Doheny Board of Directors signed a long-term affiliation agreement with UCLA's Stein Eye Institute, combining the strength, reputation, and distinction of two of the nation's top eye institutions. She also oversaw Doheny's strategic relocation to a new, state-ofthe-art campus in Pasadena in 2021. This campus brings key operations together under one roof: administrative, research and soon also patient care – with the planned Q1 2025 opening of the new Doheny Eye Center UCLA Pasadena.

Currently, Doheny scientists are actively investigating several diseases that cause vision impairment and loss in a growing number of the population, including diabetic retinopathy, uveitis and age-related macular degeneration (AMD), as well as identifying innovative ways to utilize artificial intelligence in helping to diagnose ocular diseases.

Examples of breakthroughs Doheny scientists have made include:

- Developed novel eye imaging equipment and computer-based retinal image analysis.
- Identified retinal biomarkers for Alzheimer's Disease
- Developed multiple animal models of ocular
- Published findings that help the scientific community better understand factors that contribute to the sudden vision loss experienced by people with Leber hereditary optic neuropathy (LHON) as they enter adulthood.
- Developed custom built equipment, called adaptive optics ophthalmoscopy, enabling scientists to do high-speed measurements of retinal blood flow, which could enhance the ability to detect blood flow alteration that could signal an early stage of eye disease.

Doheny has ranked in the Top 10 Best Ophthalmology Hospitals by U.S. News and World Report each year since rankings began in 1993, and in the Top 5 since Doheny's affiliation with UCLA Stein Eye Institute in 2013.



Across JVS SoCal's three healthcare programs, more than 50 employer partners are hiring graduates and making generous contributions to help underwrite their education.



ealthcare professionals can agree that removing waste, streamlining processes, improving quality and enhancing clinician and patient experience are core competencies. After gaining expertise through a curriculum based on the Lean Healthcare Systems Engineering (LHSE) approach, over 120 LMU graduates are embedded in healthcare organizations throughout the US and beyond, attacking inefficiencies, bottlenecks, fragmentation, disparities, and poor quality. The methodology carefully examines all aspects of a problem in a rigorous framework that addresses issues from every angle. Solutions for issues with waste, bottlenecks, fragmented communication, poor quality, and the ability to integrate the solution into the rest of the system are all part of what LMU Healthcare Systems Engineering students learn.

In our program, we take students and healthcare professionals of all types (some with science background, and some without) and train them in the principles of the LHSE system, adding coursework in quality and safety, big data and population health, project management, principles and architecture of the electronic health record, and common issues in nearly all venues where healthcare is practiced.

Most students finish in about a year, and upon graduation, are ready to contribute immediately, wherever they land in the healthcare universe. Our faculty includes industry leaders in healthcare operations, project management, leadership, healthcare IT, industrial engineering, and quality, and is augmented by prominent guests from throughout healthcare. 


